In December the graduates took a trip to the Libby Dam located in nearby Libby, Montana. We learned some very fascinating facts about dams. Libby Dam is a dam that backs the Kootenai River and forms Lake Kooconusa. The lake's name is three words put together "Koo" from the Kootenai River, "Can" from Canada, and "USA" from the United States of America. The lake is very long it extends 48 miles into Montana, and 42 miles into Canada! Libby Dam controls flooding, and generates power that can reach as far as Nevada or California! One aspect that I enjoyed was the sculpture on the front of the "Treaty Tower." This sculpture was created to

symbolize the cooperation from both the US and Canada to build the Libby Dam, one of the dams that was part of Columbia River Treaty. The sculpture weighs over seventy-five tons and had to be divided up into nine slabs of granite to be able to be hung up.

Scrambled Eggs

A Turning Winds' Recipe by Ian

1. Set out following items: 6 eggs, milk, and butter, cheese, old bay spice and seasoned salt
2. Set out following items: bowl, whisk, skillet and spatula
